WHEREAS, Pauline is retiring from Warren County Community Services after 25 years of volunteer service, 23 as Director of the Kings Local Food Pantry in South Lebanon; and

WHEREAS, among her many deserving honors are serving as a parade Grand Marshall; being named a Kentucky Colonel; induction into the Warren County Education Hall of Fame; WCCS Volunteer of the Year; and a Warren County Commissioners' Proclamation naming May 18, 2011 as Pauline Holloway Day; and
