He said 141 E. McKinley, 41 E. McKinley, 15 Broadway, 66 W. McKinley, and 46 W. McKinley. The county has to have a plan to disperse and are looking at 1/3 to rehab, 1/3 for homeless projects and 1/3 for demolition. Bob said the ODNR money which is close to \$5000 can do the gazebo and walk way in the Main Street Park. He said that LCNB has applied for their permits. Bob also said Target has applied for a liquor license and we can request a hearing if want to. No one had a desire for a hearing. Bob also said Rozzi's is sending application for the fireworks and township is still interested in paying half. Craig said the county will be getting the easements for the two bridges to be constructed at Lebanon Road. He also said a public hearing for Head Start is going to be held. Mayor Smith stated he was doing a great job.

5. Solicitor Nixon said he has spoke with the bank about the CDBG loan that the home is in foreclosure. He said he has not received a figure on what they want to pay yet. He said he has reviewed the other outstanding CDBG loans with Sharon and is researching the fact that some have changed hands without the debt being paid.
6. Sgt. Boylan asked if he needed to post overtime for extra patrol during the quilt show and Mayor Smith said to coordinate with Bob.
7. Council member Madison said he would like to share with council feed back on the annexation Tuesday the 3rd with commissioners. He said it is a balancing act of our growth and rural setting and the protection and preservation of our natural resource. He stated that as our logo shows the river running through our village as well as the statement of reclaiming our past. Bill stated anything but a yes vote is against preservation and I praise council and the mayor for stepping up to the plate and shedding a light for others to follow.
8. Council member Carbo said she would like to commend the snow plowing crew. She said hands down ours were the best. Holloway said he agrees with Sherri and said Mason was the only one better but they used salt on everything.
